The s	ketch needs to:
	be legible be generally to scale indicate what direction is north show dimensions in metric units fit on a single page
The s	ketch may:
	be done by hand or on a computer include a table outlining building setback and size dimensions
Applic	cations require a sketch showing the following:
	the boundaries and dimensions of the subject land Buildings and Structures Existing, proposed or to be demolished (labeled) Location, indicating distance from the front lot line, rear lot line and side lot lines Type Area
	 Dimensions Servicing, if applicable (wells, septic tanks) the approximate location of all natural and artificial features (for example buildings, railways, roads, watercourses, drainage ditches, banks of rivers or streams, wetlands, wooded areas) that:
	 are located on the subject land and on land that is adjacent to it, and in the applicant's opinion, may affect the application
Ш	the current uses of land that is adjacent to the subject land (for example, residential, agricultural, or commercial)
	the location, width and name of any roads within or abutting the subject land, indicating whether it is an unopened road allowance, a public travelled road, a private road or a right of way
	if access to the subject land will be by water only, the location of the parking and docking facilities to be used
	the location and nature of any easement affecting the subject land
Site P	lans for Consent (Severance) Applications also Require:
	the boundaries and dimensions of any land abutting (bordering) the subject land that is owned by the owner of the subject land
	the approximate distance between the subject land and the nearest original surveyed
	township lot line or landmark such as a bridge or railway crossing the boundaries and dimensions of the subject land, the part that is intended to be
	severed and the part that is intended to be retained the location of all land previously severed from the parcel originally acquired by the current owner of the subject land
