The Bruce County Rail Trail Fencing Sub-Committee will be setting priorities for the installation of fence along the former CNR corridor for 2024. This corridor starts at the Huron County boundary north of Clifford and extends through Mildmay, Walkerton, and Paisley to Port Elgin and southerly to the BNPD. By way of this notification the Sub-Committee will gain information to set priorities where, and if, new fence is to be installed.
