

Proposed Alternate Truck Route

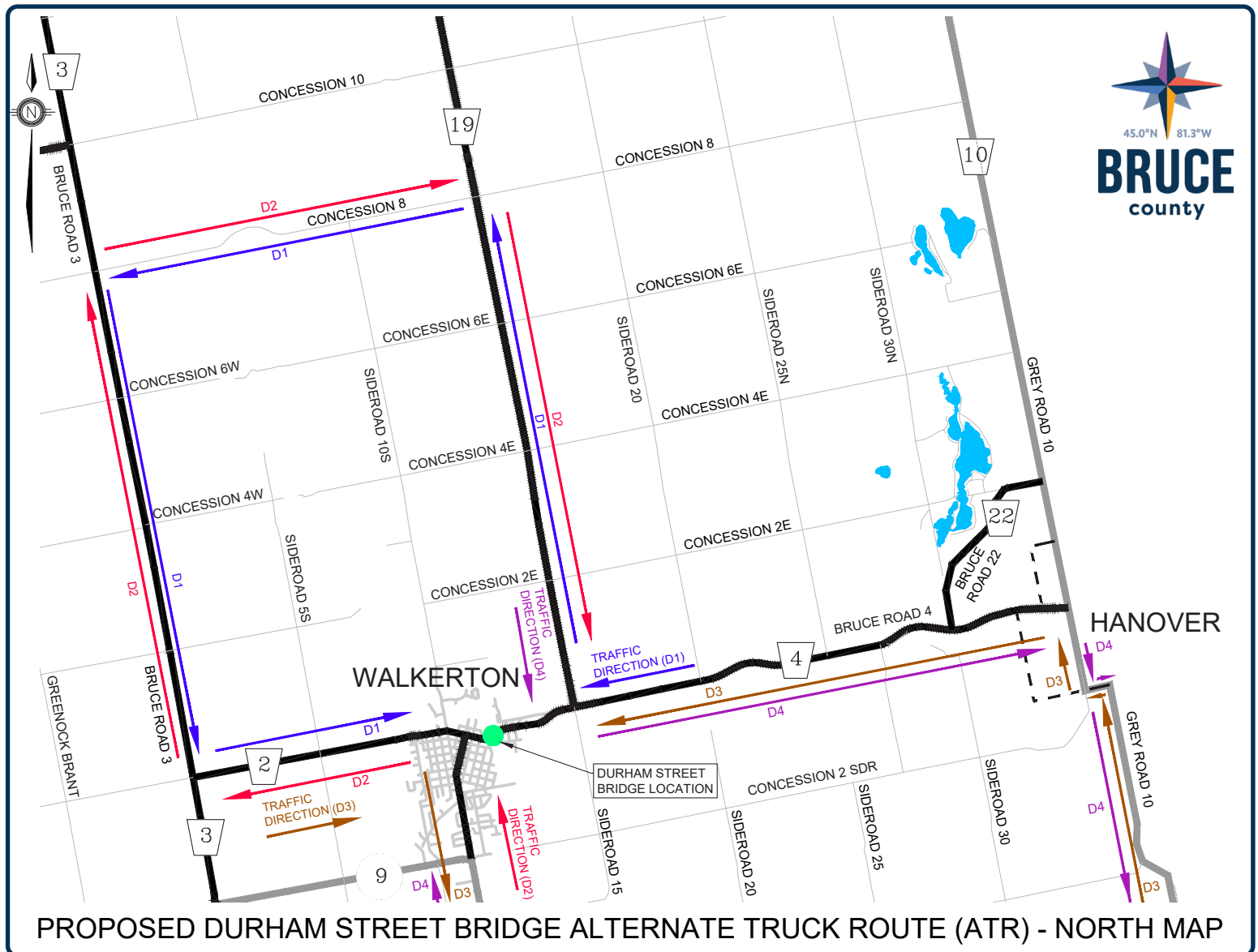
Durham Street Bridge, Walkerton

The ongoing third-party review of the Durham Street Bridge in Walkerton recommends that Heavy Truck Traffic, with exceptions to Municipal maintenance and Fire/EMS vehicles, should be restricted from crossing the bridge until rehabilitation/repairs are made. Bruce County will be seeking to implement two Alternate Truck Routes once agreements are reached with affected municipalities.

The ATRs will facilitate the continued movement of truck traffic during the bridge weight restriction period on the Durham Street Bridge.

Advanced Warning signage for the ATR's will be placed strategically ahead of the bridge to divert heavy truck traffic from passing over the bridge.

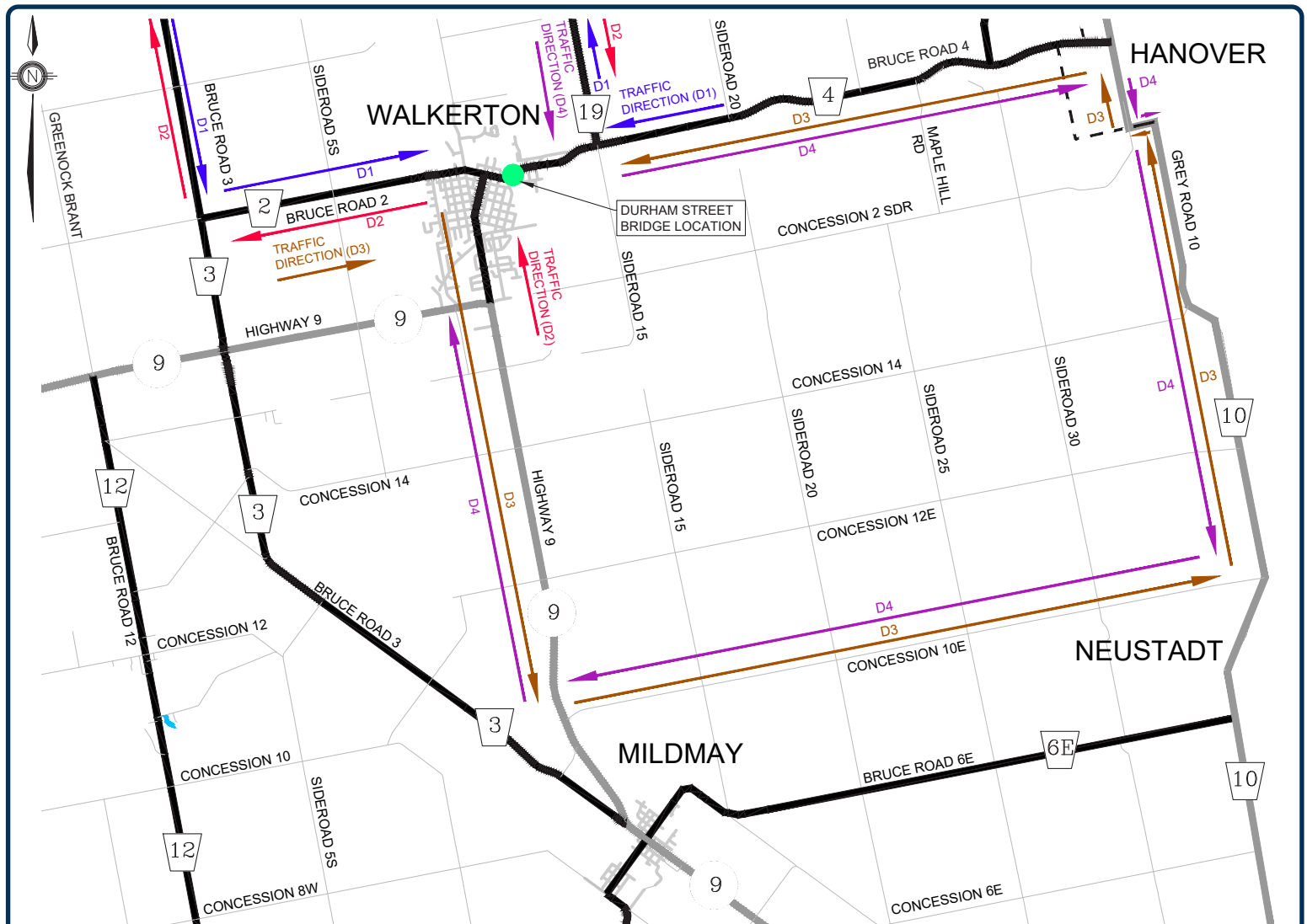
The weight restriction would be a 3-level load limit which differentiates various heavy truck types by the number of axles on the truck or trailers and permits a maximum vehicle weight. The recommended weight restrictions would apply to vehicles greater than 15, 25, and 30 tonnes, with corresponding axles.
