Welcome to Bruce County's Journey Through the Ages and Stages

The first few years of life are very important for your child because they set the stage for their journey in learning. During this time, your child will gain many experiences and learn many new skills. You are an active partner in your child's learning and development, and we want to help you provide the best start for your child.

Bruce County Children's Services uses the **Ages and Stages Questionnaires**® **(ASQ)** to help you understand and guide your child's development. It helps parents or guardians celebrate their child's milestones and provides information on what to look for next. This journey is also an essential first step in accessing services to enhance your child's development and well-being.

When completing both the ASQ-3 and the ASQ-SE-2, you will get an overall picture of your child's development by answering questions on topics such as communication, motor skills, problem solving, personal-social skills, self-regulation, compliance, affect, and more.

To ensure the questions and responses are age appropriate for your child, it is important to complete the questionnaires and return them to your service provider within two weeks.

We appreciate your participation! The information collected will not only provide you with important information on your child's development, it will also provide the County of Bruce with information to better support children in our community.

The "What"

What is Bruce County's Journey Through the Ages and Stages?

Bruce County's Journey Through the Ages and Stages uses the Ages and Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) to explore developmental and social emotional progress of children. This proactive approach allows for the child care system to be responsive to children's learning, development and wellbeing.

What are the goals of the Journey Through the Ages and Stages?

- Parents and caregivers will be more informed regarding the developmental needs of their child(ren).
- Families will have access to services that support their child's journey in learning.
- Completing the questionnaire will help the Early Years Community in Bruce County plan and help create programs to support the needs of the child in our community.

What is the ASQ-3?



The ASQ-3 is a questionnaire that provides a quick look at how your child(ren) is doing in the following areas:

- Communication: What your child understands and can say
- 2 Gross Motor: How your child uses their larger muscles to sit, crawl, walk, run and do other activities
- Fine Motor: How your child uses their hands and fingers to move and coordinate
- 4 Problem Solving: How your child plays with toys and solves problems
- 5 Personal-Social: Your child's selfhelp and interaction skills





What is the **ASQ-SE-2**?

The ASQ-SE-2 is a tool to support early identification of young children who may be experiencing social-emotional delays. This tool can help identify and respond to parent/guardian's concerns early, so the child's behaviour does not become a barrier to a healthy relationship. The ASQ-SE-2 provides a quick look at how children are doing in the following areas:

- 1 Self-Regulation: Ability to calm, settle, and adjust to physiological or environmental conditions
- 2 Compliance: Ability to follow the direction and rules of others
- 3 Adaptive Functioning: Ability to cope with physiological needs (e.g., sleeping, eating, elimination, safety)
- 4 Autonomy: Ability to self-initiate without guidance and move towards independence
- Affect: Ability to respond to his or her own feelings and empathy for others
- 6 Social-Communication: Ability to interact with others by responding to or initiating verbal or nonverbal signals to indicate interests, needs and feelings
- 7 Interaction with People: Ability to respond to or initiate social responses from parents, other adults, and peers

What happens after I complete and return the questionnaires? Will I get the results?

Your completed questionnaires will be reviewed by an Early Childhood Educator (Resource Consultant) from Bruce County's Children's Services Team. If the questionnaires identify any concerns based on a validated criterion, a Bruce County Resource Consultant will be in contact with you in 4 - 6 weeks to review the questionnaires and discuss possible next steps.

If there are no identified concerns, the information will be used to help inform trends and programming needs to better serve families in Bruce County and you will not be contacted.

The "score" of the questionnaire is not as important as the resources and supports that are provided through the Journey Through the Ages and Stages process.

What will happen with the information?

General information will provide the County of Bruce with data to better support children in our community.

Information about you and your child will only be shared with other agencies with your written consent.

What if I received more than one package from a service provider?

You only need to complete one ASQ package if you choose to participate. If you completed one in the last 6 months you are not required to complete another. Please let your service provider know that you will be completing it elsewhere.

What if my child is already involved in support services?

It is recommended that parents and guardians of ALL children between the ages of o-60 months complete the questionnaires regardless of needs and/or current supports.

Information gathered will not only help support those in need, but it will also give the County of Bruce information on the service needs of the community for planning and service delivery.

Why should I participate?

- Your answers will help you learn more about your child's developmental milestones.
- The questionnaires will show your child's strengths and highlight any areas in which your child may need more help or practice.
- Your answers will be helpful in determining whether your child needs further support or assessment.
- Completing the questionnaires will help the Child Care and Early Years Community in Bruce County plan and help create programs to support the needs of children.

Why should I complete both the ASQ-3 and the ASQ:SE-2? Some questions are repetitive.

Since there is a relationship between behaviour and development, it is important to look at both areas. The ASQ-3 explores child development whereas the ASQ:SE-2 addresses the broad and complex nature of social emotional development and behaviours. Completing both provides a more holistic view of your child's overall development, which can help child care providers and families identify concerns earlier and make informed decisions about referrals and support.



How long will it take to complete?

The questionnaires will take about 15-30 minutes to complete.

How do I complete the questionnaires?

You will answer each question by checking off "Yes", "Sometimes" or "Not Yet" for the ASQ-3 and "Often", "Sometimes" or "Rarely" for the ASQ – SE-2 based on what your child is able to do.

To answer the questions, you can try fun and simple activities with your child to encourage them to play, move around and practice day-to-day skills.

If you need supplies (toys, bottles, dolls, etc.) to complete the questionnaires, you can visit an EarlyON Centre or borrow a kit from your licensed Bruce County Child Care Provider.

Can my child care provider complete the questionnaire on my child?

The ASQs are designed to be parent/guardian completed. If you wish to have your child care provider complete an ASQ alongside you, feel free to reach out to them.

Are there any translations of the ASQ?

Yes! The ASQ-3 is available in Arabic, Chinese, French, Spanish and Vietnamese. The ASQ:SE-2 is available in Arabic, French and Spanish.

If you would like a translated ASQ, please reach out to your child care provider and we will ensure you receive the version most suitable to your needs.

Are the ASQs available online?

Currently, an online version of the ASQ is not available in Canada. Bruce County Children's Services is working with Brookes Publishing, the developer of the ASQ, to provide an online version for Canadian residents that protects the privacy of users.

Where can I find more developmentally appropriate activities to do with my child?

If you are interested in learning activities that are age appropriate for your child, you can email childcare@brucecounty.on.ca with your child's date of birth and we can send you some sample activities.

Be a Part of Canada's First National Database of Child Development!

What exactly is the Canadian National Database of Child Development?

The Canadian National Database of Child Development houses developmental scores from children birth to 5.

The scores are used to strengthen our national understanding of how children are reaching developmental milestones, as well as the developmental areas that require the most support so we can build or adapt programs and policies to address these identified needs.

What information is included in the National Database? Why?

Scores from all 5 domains in the Ages and Stages Questionnaire-3 (ASQ-3) and the overall score of the Ages and Stages Questionnaire Social-Emotional:2 (ASQ-SE:2), as well as relevant demographic data, are included in the National Database.

More information regarding individual and population-level child development can help us better support your family, and families across Canada, through these early years.

What do I need to do to provide data to the National Database?

If you have a child up to 5 years old, their ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE:2 data can be included in the National Database!

All you need to do is complete one ASQ-3 and ASQ-SE:2 provided by, or with, your childcare provider twice a year, alongside some brief demographic questions. Filling out these forms is quick and can take less than 15 minutes!

Where is the data stored? Is it safe?

No identifiable information is added to the National Database. All data is completely anonymized before being entered into the National Database.

The data is stored on a secure server in the Centre for Advanced Computing, at Queen's University in Kingston, Ontario. There is no public access to the Database.
