News From the Nursing Department

Gateway Haven was successful in becoming a Registered Nurses' Association of Ontario (RNAO) Best Practice Spotlight Organization (BPSO) designated site. The BPSO designation is awarded to health service and academic organizations that implement and evaluate evidence-based practice guidelines to improve health outcomes. BPSO is a global recognition for Gateway Haven's commitment to evidence-based practice, high quality healthcare, and continuous improvement in resident care practices. As a BPSO, Gateway Haven hosted the RNAO Champions workshop in the month of October and will be hosting another Champions workshop in November. The Champion's training is designed to raise awareness about RNAO best practice guidelines (BPG), mobilize the team, and use change management processes and social movement approaches to influence uptake and sustainability of BPGs in our practice settings to benefit the community we serve.

We are equally excited to share that Gateway Haven created its first ever IV Team which consists of a group of nurses who are IV Champions that will support residents requiring IV Therapy or Venipuncture when needed. This embedded team is supported with routine refresher training on IV management and venipuncture. This supports our nurse's professional growth and skill development, maintenance of clinical competencies and contributes to enhanced resident care as our home continues to require more clinically complex services.

Family Council

Our Family Council continues to meet monthly in the library at 6:30 p.m. The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, November 26 and will be the last meeting of the year. The Council has decided not to meet in December due to the busy holiday season. Meetings will be reconvened in the new year.

All families are invited and encouraged to attend, either in person or virtually. Family Council meetings are a terrific opportunity to receive updates, share feedback, ask questions, and connect with other families who share a commitment to enhancing life in our home.


Community Events
